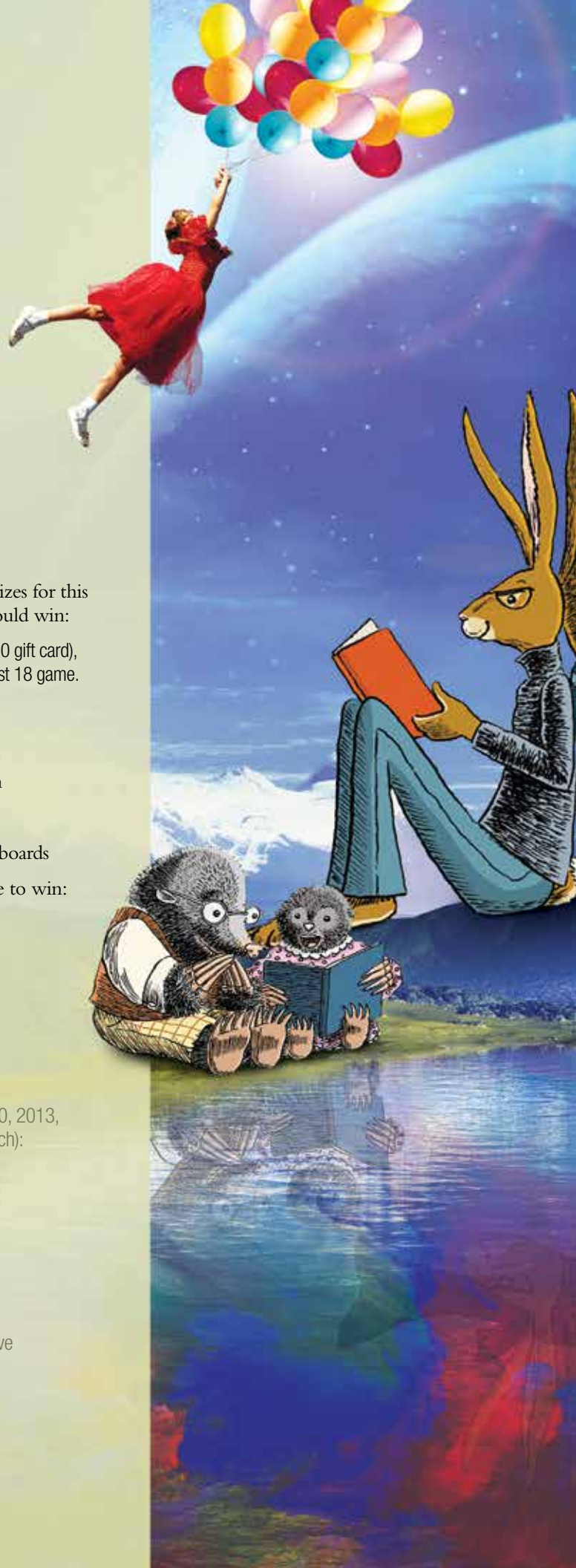

PRIZES REVEALED!

GROW UP GREAT WITH PNC

It's the perfect match—FCPL's Summer Reading Program (SRP) and PNC's Grow Up Great program. Grow Up Great is a \$350 million, multi-year, bilingual initiative that began in 2004 to help prepare children from birth to age five, particularly those who are underserved, for success in school and life.

"PNC has been a Summer Reading Program sponsor for four years now, and it's a partnership with tremendous value for children throughout Frederick County," explains FCPL Director Darrell Batson. In addition to funding, PNC provides employee volunteers who help with select SRP activities at FCPL branches countywide. PNC also celebrates with SRP grand-prize winners at a Frederick Keys game.

"The Summer Reading Program is easy to support," says Stacey Collins, Manager of Client & Community Relations for PNC. "Education is a fundamental building block to achievement, and reading is fundamental to education." Collins points to recent studies that show underserved five-year-olds enter kindergarten with the vocabulary of an average 3½-year-old. They start school with an 18-month disadvantage, she says, and the gap widens as they move into first, second, and third grades. "Supporting the educational achievement of students, especially the youngest members of our county through programs like this, is an important part of what PNC does in the community." As the award-winning host of *Fresh Air*, NPR's weekday magazine of contemporary arts and issues, Terry Gross interviews the most celebrated personalities of our time. Her thoughtful exchanges with artists, writers, actors, and musicians are heard by more than 4.5 million fans on nearly 500 public radio stations. Her guests have included Philip Roth, James Brown, John Travolta, Sonny Rollins, Triumph the Insult Comic Dog, and countless others. Gross is known for her thoughtful, probing interview style. In her trusted company, even the most reticent guest relaxes and reflects on his or her life and work.

In her speaking engagements, Gross plays sound bites from interviews that went especially well and especially badly to illustrate her discussion of interviewing techniques. The arrival of summer means it's time to head for the deck—especially the deck at Thurmont Regional Library.

According to Erin Dingle, Administrator, Thurmont Regional Library and Emmitsburg Branch Library, there's no better place to relax, soak up the sun, and sit back and enjoy nature. "We always encourage people to use the deck to read and relax or enjoy a family picnic after a story program," she says. "A lot of our patrons take advantage of the free Wi-Fi, bringing their laptop and enjoying the quiet while they work."

The atmosphere on the deck switches from quiet to lively this summer during the Sunday afternoon Music on the Deck concert series, which is free and appropriate for all ages. Tara Leberz, Children's Services Supervisor, who is also a member of the local band, The Yardslippers, used her music connections to schedule this summer's lineup.

"We've booked some very talented local musicians whose music is known far beyond Frederick County," she says. "Alexander Mitchell and Zane McLeod are extremely talented multi-instrumentalists, and the two of them together will be a real treat. I'm a big fan of family bands, and I know the Martin Family Band will really impress the audience. Mountain Ride came highly recommended, and I'm looking forward to hearing them, too."

Leberz also looks forward to the Thursday evening Nighttime on the Deck series, which launched last year with grant funding. This year, the series is sponsored by the Thurmont Lion's Club, and the Thurmont Thespians recently agreed to preview their summer show for kids in July. "It's shaping up to be a busy and fun summer, with lots of people in the library and on the deck every day," Leberz says.

FCPL IN KOSOVO

FCPL's Manager of Corporate and Community Partnerships Elizabeth Cromwell was honored to be the keynote speaker at National Library Week in Kosovo in April. She was invited by the U.S. Embassy in Pristina, Kosovo, to share her knowledge about creating community programs such as Frederick Reads and other library outreach initiatives through partnerships. Her eight-day visit included presentations, meetings, and roundtable discussions in many cities across the nation.

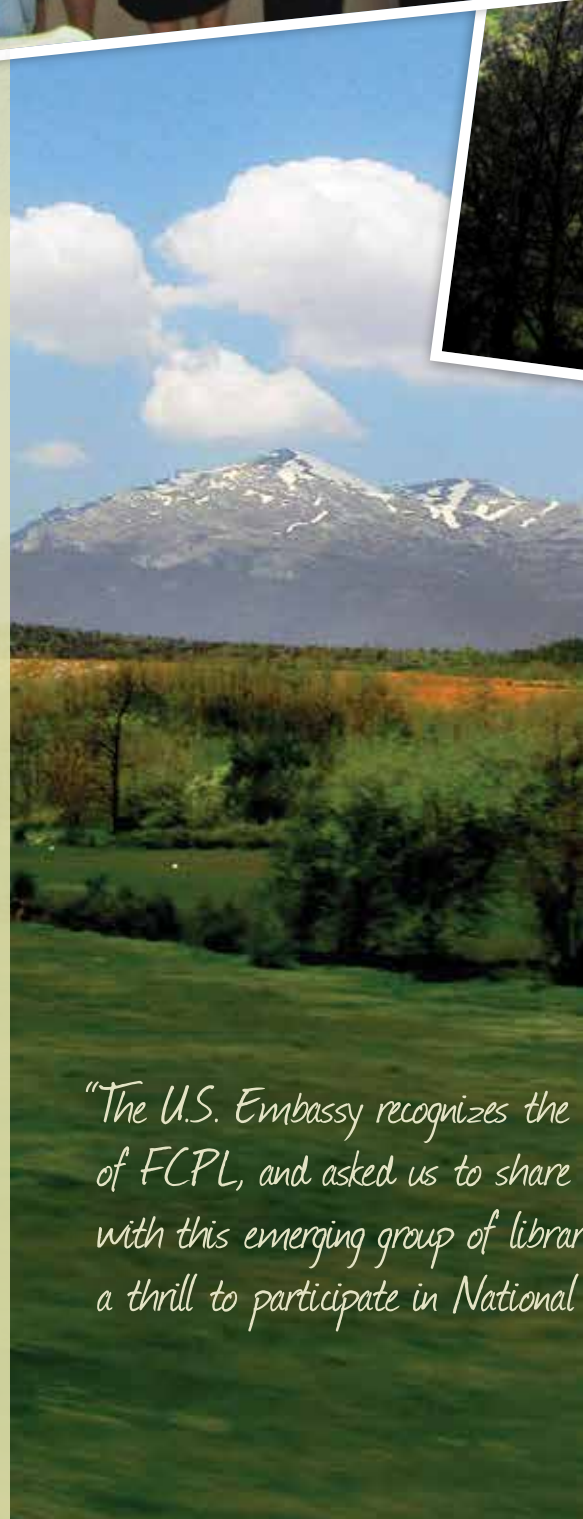
"Visiting Kosovo was an experience I will never forget," Cromwell reflects.

"Despite the heartbreaking losses they have endured over many years, the librarians are enthusiastically building (or sometimes rebuilding) libraries that they hope will be more than book warehouses or study halls. The U.S. Embassy recognizes the programming successes of FCPL, and asked us to share our successes and challenges with this emerging group of libraries. It was an honor and a thrill to participate in National Library Week of Kosovo."

In addition to her keynote presentations, Cromwell was featured on Kosovo's national morning news television program and also facilitated a variety of conversations between authors, the national library, university libraries, and public libraries. It was her first time communicating in a different language from the other participants, and she was ably assisted by a translator who transformed her thoughts into Albanian, the predominant language of Kosovo.

Travels through snow-capped mountain passes and quiet farming communities provided her with a new sense of the role of libraries. As she visited many smaller towns away from the capital of Pristina, Cromwell modified her remarks to be more relevant to the needs of each community. Among the challenges she noted is that their collections are in great need of enhancement. "I learned that most of the materials written in Albanian were burned during the Kosovo War of 1999, so there are not many books written in their native language in existence." Well-intentioned countries have donated books, cds and dvds, albeit in a variety of languages other than Albanian. Still, these materials are a good start to building a collection that reflects the needs of the people, and many Kosovo residents are becoming fluent in a variety of languages besides Albanian, which will be critical to their future success as their country develops.

One of the people Cromwell met at the U.S. Embassy was a writer named Doug Morris. He is the co-founder of Books for Kosovo, which hopes to receive 10,000 books in 2013 to line the library shelves for the people in Kosovo who are hungry for knowledge. 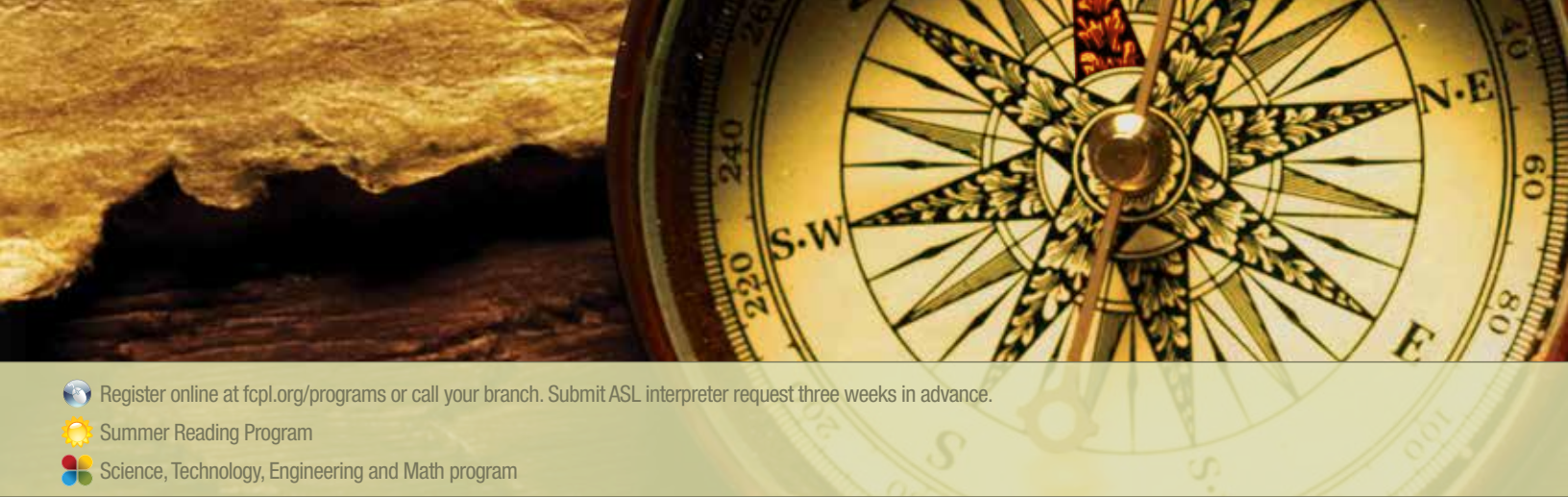
